


24HR SPONSORED WALK



Our pupils will be benefitting from bug hotels and specialised microscopes which will be used within Science and conservation lessons. The project is run by Learning through Landscapes and funded by Postcode Local Trust, which receives funding from players of People's Postcode Lottery.
